The Board recesses at 12:00 noon and reconvenes at 12:15 p.m. with all members present.

Upon motion of Supervisor Kelsey, seconded by Supervisor Pedrozo, duly carried, the Board upholds the Appeal thereby rejecting the Planning Director's CEQA decision and exempting the Application under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, the "Common Sense" exemption and finds there is a credible explanation that removes any doubt that there is a potential for causing a significant affect on the environment based upon the following Findings:

- 1. No evidence of piecemealing was presented.
- 2. The applicant and the Farm Bureau testified and presented evidence that there would be a net reduction of average daily truck trips by allowing added storage on sight instead of spreading it to multiple off-site locations.
- 3. All speakers at the Planning Commission and Public Hearing before the Board of Supervisors refuted the fair argument that the additional building would have a significant adverse environmental affect. The evidence was that the additional building would reduce existing environmental affects. The applicant stated there is no additional water or sewage usage as a result of the building.
