2002-07-02 SHERIFF – PUBLIC HEARING

The time and date previously set for a Public Hearing to consider the Department of Justice 2002 Local Law Enforcement Block Grant submitted by the Sheriff's Department.

Jo Ann Phelps, Sheriff Department Director of Administration, reviews the Staff Report. She states The Local Law Enforcement Advisory Board recommends the following expenditures with the grant funds and budget transfers will be submitted for final approval when funding is received:

\$40,000 - Add two Polycom Video Systems, with respective ancillary items such as TV, ISDN lines, stand, telephone lines, etc., for video court arraignment. One system for Main Jail replacement (moved to Los Banos for 180 day trial period), and one to be added to Department 4 (when used for criminal matters). The Sheriff Department would assume ownership and the grant would offset cost of the two systems purchase and on-going monthly communication and maintenance costs.

\$71,698 - Purchase of vests for Law Enforcement. The Sheriff and the Law Enforcement Advisory Board are recommending the purchase of a (Generation 9) vest that is light weight and yet has a much higher safety technology factor than current vest. Cost per vest with accessories-approximately \$1,100.00 each. The recommended amount with match will allow for the purchase of up to 65 vests.

The Chairman asks if there is anyone present who wishes to speak. No one speaks.

2002-07-02 PLANNING - PUBLIC HEARING

Planning Director Bill Nicholson reviews the Staff Report advising the Planning and Financial Consultant Keyser Marston Associates is assisting in the preparation of the redevelopment feasibility study for the County and has completed a preliminary "boundary evaluation" for the 13 unincorporated areas. Mr. Nicholson states the Planning Dept has met with the Municipal Advisory Councils about the redevelopment study that is underway and notification has been sent to various special districts, community groups and nearby cities for areas being studied that do not have Municipal Advisory Councils. Planning staff and the consultant conducted a public forum on June 10, 2002, to explain the concept of redevelopment, the

preliminary boundaries that have been identified, and to ask for identification of any projects that should be considered in the feasibility analysis (such as pending commercial developments). Representatives from Planada, Delhi, Franklin/Beachwood, Castle, Merced and Atwater attended this workshop.

The consultants are presently preparing the financial feasibility analysis, which will help determine whether the projected increase in property tax assessments in each identified community would support formation of a redevelopment project area with adequate revenue to successfully complete projects. Input from the Municipal Advisory Councils is also being accepted on the preliminary boundary evaluation. A workshop for the Board of Supervisors to present the feasibility analysis and seek direction on alternative methods for establishing redevelopment areas is being set for August 13, 2002. Representatives from the 13 communities evaluated will also be invited to this workshop.

Upon motion of Supervisor Kelsey, seconded by Supervisor Cortez Keene, duly carried, the Board accepts the presentation and schedules the Study Session for the Redevelopment Feasibility Study for August 13, 2002.
