The Clerk announces consideration of extending the Public Comment Period for the Riverside Motorsports Park Draft EIR from December 23, 2005 to January 6, 2006 submitted by Planning is before the Board.

Supervisor Crookham moves, seconded by Supervisor Pedrozo, to extend the Public Comment Period for the Riverside Motorsports Park Draft EIR from December 23, 2005 to January 6, 2006.

Supervisor Kelsey states based on the size of the Draft EIR, she would like to recommend the extension be longer.

The Chairman asks for clarification from Counsel.

Deputy County Counsel James Fincher states that 60 days is a maximum extension except for unusual circumstances, than it is possible for a 90 day extension and states he does not believe this matter falls under that ruling.

Supervisor Kelsey states she feels findings could substantiate usual circumstances to allow the extension and is not convinced the public has had enough time to review the Draft EIR.

Supervisor Kelsey recommends the Board hold a study session with Planning Commission and would like to amend the motion to include the Study Session.

Supervisor Kelsey moves, seconded by Supervisor Crookham, to amend the Motion to extend the comment period as stated to include a Study Session between the Board and Planning Commission.

Supervisor Kelsey states she would also like the Public Opportunity be held for members of the audience to comment further on the matter.

The Chairman states earlier today it was clearly stated that public comments were to be taken at the 5:00 p.m. Public Opportunity to Speak. The Chairman re-opens the Public Opportunity.

The following speak in favor: Mark Osborn, Lisa Kaiser-Grant, Cameron Doyel, Foster Farms Representative Jim Marriotti, Annette Allsup, Melissa Kelley Ortega and John Grant.

Riverside Motorsports Park Vice President Mark Melville comments and states the Draft EIR circulation and comment period fully meets the law and RMP fully recognizes the public benefit of the extension. He further states it is their opinion that an extension that would exceed the 60 days is totally unwarranted advising a substantial amount of time and money has been invested.

Following discussion, the Chairman states the Motion before the Board is to extend the Public Comment Period on the Draft EIR for 60 days to close on January 6, 2006 and will include a Study Session with the Board and Planning Commission.

Following further discussion, Supervisor Kelsey moves to amend her previous motion, to include extending the Public Comment Period to 90 days instead of 60 days from the time of issuance.

The Chairman calls for a vote on the Amendment to the Motion. Motion dies for lack of second.
