- The Winton Spring Festival Committee to provide the County of Merced with a Certificate of Insurance certifying liability and property damage insurance coverage of a minimum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limits for all activities to be conducted at the Park April 16 23, 2007, and for the parade on April 21, 2007. Insurance documents to be provided to the Parks and Recreation Office by April 9, 2007.
- 2. The Winton Cowboys non-profit organization is to provide the County of Merced with a Certificate of Insurance certifying liability coverage, product liability, including liquor liability insurance; of a minimum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limits to cover the sale of alcoholic beverages to the general public. All Certificates of Insurance must include the endorsement, "County of Merced, its agents, officers, and employees are additional insureds." Insurance documents to be provided to the Parks and Recreation Office by April 9, 2007.
- 3. All food vendors to provide the County of Merced with a Certificate of Insurance certifying liability and product liability insurance coverage of a minimum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single limits for all activities to be conducted at the Park by April 9, 2007.
- 4. The sale of alcoholic beverages shall comply with the rules, regulations, and requirements of the California State Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. The Committee must provide in writing how they plan to secure that no minors can purchase alcohol.
- 5. The carnival operator shall have valid permits and inspection certificates required by the State of California to operate this type of business and will provide the County of Merced with a Certificate of Insurance certifying liability, property damage and product liability insurance coverage of a minimum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) combined single

limits for all activities to be conducted at the Park April 16 - 23, 2007. All Certificates of Insurance must include the endorsement, "County of Merced, its agents, officers, and employees are additional insured".

- 6. The Committee shall provide additional portable restroom facilities as required by Health Department as may be needed, at no cost to the County of Merced.
- 7. Contract with the Sheriff's Department for security personnel, or should private security be used, the Sheriff's Department will need to approve the firm used and coordinate its activities and a copy of the approval provided to the Parks & Recreation Office.
- 8. Provide additional refuse bins as may be required or arrange for the daily removal of refuse. Any additional refuse costs to the County will be reimbursed by the Committee.
- 9. Obtain all necessary Health Permits and Business License Permits as required by the Health Department and Commerce Aviation and Economic Development.
- 10. Committee must inform all neighbors to the park that amplified sound will be allowed and indicate the hours the carnival will operate.
- 11. Committee must obtain a dance permit from the Merced County Sheriff's Department.
