The petitions must be filed no later than 5 p.m. February 20th with the Merced County Elections Office. Within 10 days of filing petitions, the candidate will be notified of any deficiency. January 21, 2014* E-133	<b>New Political Party Qualification Announcement</b> The last day for the Secretary of State to determine whether a new political party has qualified either by registration or by filing a petition. <i>California Elections Code §5100</i>
January 23, 2014 E-131	<b>Statewide Ballot Propositions</b> Last day for statewide initiative or referendum measures, constitutional amendments, bond measures, or other legislative measures to qualify for the primary election ballot. <i>California Constitution Article II §8(c) &amp; E.C. §9040</i>
January 27, 2014 February 5, 2014 E-127 to E-118	<b>Declaration of Intention Period for Superior Court Judge</b> Between these dates, candidates for Judge of the Superior Court must file a Declaration of Intention with the Merced County Elections Office. The nonrefundable filing fee represented by money, petitions in lieu of filing fee, or any prorated combination must be paid at the time of filing the Declaration of Intention. <i>California Elections Code §§8023, 8105</i>
January 31, 2014 E-123	<b>Campaign Disclosure – Semi-Annual Reporting Deadline</b> Last day to file semi-annual campaign disclosure statements, if required, by all candidates and committees for the period ending December 31, 2013. <i>Government Code §§84200, 84218</i>
February 6, 2014 February 10, 2014 E-117 to E-113	<b>Declaration of Intention Extension Period for Superior Court Judge</b> If the incumbent Judge fails to file a Declaration of Intention to succeed to the same office by 5 p.m. February 5th, qualified persons other than the incumbent may file such declaration for that office during the extension period. The nonrefundable filing fee represented by money, petitions in lieu of filing fee, or any prorated combination must be paid at the time of filing the Declaration of Intention. <i>California Elections Code §§8023(b), 8105</i>

<p><b>February 10, 2014</b> <b>March 7, 2014</b> <b>E-113 to E-88</b></p>	<p><b>No Candidate May Withdraw</b> No candidate whose declaration of candidacy has been filed for any primary election may withdraw as a candidate at that primary election. <i>California Elections Code §8800</i></p>
<p><b>February 10, 2014</b> <b>March 7, 2014</b> <b>E-113 to E-88</b></p>	<p><b>Candidate Statement of Qualifications Filing Period</b> Between these dates, candidates may prepare a Candidate Statement of Qualifications on a form provided by the Merced County Elections Office to be printed in the Sample Ballot Booklet. The statement shall not exceed 200 words (250 if a state legislative office) and the candidate will be required to pay the predetermined advance payment. The statement shall be filed and advance payment made at the time nomination documents are returned for filing. The statement may be withdrawn, but not changed, during the period for filing nomination documents and until 5 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period. In addition to the restrictions set forth in §13307, any candidate's statement submitted shall be limited to a recitation of the candidate's own personal background and qualifications, and shall not in any way make reference to other candidates for that office or to another candidate's qualifications, character, or activities. Elected incumbents who have a statement on file for the same jurisdiction will not be required to file a Form 700. <i>Government Code §87200 et seq.</i></p>

<p><b>March 7, 2014</b> <b>E-88</b></p>	<p><b>Consolidation of Election - Final Submission of Resolutions</b> Final deadline for local jurisdictions to submit the resolution to consolidate their election with the June 3, 2014 Gubernatorial Primary Election and submit any measure text and a 75 word ballot question. <i>California Elections Code §§10403, 10403.5, 10401, 13247</i></p>
<p><b>March 7, 2014</b> <b>E-88</b></p>	<p><b>Jurisdictional Boundary Changes Deadline</b> Last day for jurisdictions consolidating their elections to make boundary changes to file them with the county elections official. <i>California Elections Code §12262</i></p>
<p><b>March 7, 2014</b> <b>E-88</b></p>	<p><b>Mailed Ballot Precincts</b> Whenever, on the 88th day before the election, there are 250 or less voters in any precinct, the elections official may designate such precinct as a mailed ballot precinct. Each voter shall be furnished with an official ballot, along with a statement that there will be no polling place for the election. <i>California Elections Code §3005</i></p>
<p><b>March 8, 2014</b> <b>March 12, 2014</b> <b>E-87 to E-83</b></p>	<p><b>Candidate Filing – Extension Period</b> Extension period for anyone other than the incumbent to file a Declaration of Candidacy and Nomination Documents if the incumbent did not file by March 7, 2014. This provision does not apply if there is no incumbent eligible to be elected. <i>California Elections Code §§8022, 8024</i></p>
<p><b>March 8, 2014</b> <b>March 12, 2014</b> <b>E-87 to E-83</b></p>	<p><b>Candidate Filing Extension Period – Judge of the Superior Court</b> If an incumbent of a judicial office dies on or before the last day prescribed for the filing of nomination documents (March 7th), or files a declaration of intention but for any reason fails to file his or her nomination documents by the last day prescribed for the filing of the papers (March 7th), an additional five (5) calendar days shall be allowed for the filing of nomination papers for the office. Any person other than the person who was the incumbent on March 7th may file nomination papers for the office during this extension, regardless of whether that person filed a Declaration of Intention, if otherwise qualified. <i>California Elections Code §8204</i></p>

<p><b>March 12, 2014</b> <b>E-83</b></p>	<p><b>Ballot Measures – Amendment or Withdrawal 5pm Deadline</b> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, whenever a legislative body has ordered that a measure or proposal be submitted to the voters of any jurisdiction at a special election, the order shall not be amended or withdrawn after the 83rd day prior to the election. The order of election shall be amended or withdrawn upon the filing of a resolution by the legislative body stating the specifics concerning the amendment or withdrawal. The resolution shall be filed with the election official not later than the 83rd day prior to the election. <i>California Elections Code §9605</i></p>
<p><b>March 13, 2014</b> <b>E-82</b></p>	<p><b>Candidate Name Placement – Randomized Alphabet Drawing</b> The Secretary of State shall conduct a drawing of the letters of the alphabet to determine the order of the names of the candidates to appear on the ballot. The resulting random order of letters constitutes the alphabet for all offices other than multi-county state legislative offices. In addition, and only if applicable, the candidate’s names will be rotated pursuant to E.C. §13111. For candidates for multi-county state legislative offices, the county elections official shall conduct a randomized alphabet drawing. <i>California Elections Code §13112</i></p>
<p><b>March 17, 2014</b> <b>E-78</b></p>	<p><b>Ballot Measures – Argument For or Against – 5 p.m. Deadline</b> Last day to file arguments for or against any local measure appearing the ballot. Arguments must be filed in the Merced County Elections Office no later than 5 p.m. on this date. Arguments shall not exceed 300 words in length and must be accompanied by a Statement of Accuracy and signed by the author(s). Forms are available from the Merced County Elections Office. Each argument shall be titled either “Argument in Favor of Measure...” or “Argument Against Measure...” (letter designation to be filled in after assignment). <i>California Elections Code §§9162 - 9166, 9315, 9316, 9502, 9503, 9600</i></p>
<p><b>March 17, 2014</b> <b>E-78</b></p>	<p><b>Ballot Measures – Tax Rate Statement or Fiscal Impact Report – 5 p.m. Deadline</b> Last day to file Tax Rate Statement or Fiscal Impact Report for any local measure appearing on the ballot. <i>California Elections Code §§9160, 9400 et seq., and other statutes may apply</i></p>
<p><b>March 17, 2014</b> <b>E-78</b></p>	<p><b>Ballot Measures – Impartial Analysis – 5 p.m. Deadline</b> Last day for County Counsel to transmit to the Merced County Elections Office an Impartial Analysis of each county, community college, school or special district ballot measure appearing on the ballot, showing the effect on existing law and the operation of the measure. The impartial analysis shall not exceed 500 words and will be printed in the Ballot Sample/Voter Information Booklet. <i>California Elections Code §§9160, 9313, 9500</i></p>
<p><b>March 17, 2014</b> <b>E-78</b></p>	<p><b>Judicial Incumbent Only Nominee – Write-In Campaign</b> In any county in which only the incumbent has filed nomination papers for the office of Judge of the Superior Court, his or her name shall not appear on the ballot unless there is filed with the elections official, within 10 days after the final date for filing nomination documents, a petition indicating that a write-in campaign will be conducted for the office and signed by 0.1 percent of the registered voters qualified to vote with respect to the office, provided that the petition shall contain at least 100 signatures but need not contain more than 600 signatures. In addition to filing the petition, any judicial write-in candidate must file, between the 57th day and the 14th day before the election, a Statement of Write-In Candidacy and obtain and file the required nomination paper. <i>California Elections Code §§8203, 8600, 8601</i></p>
<p><b>March 24, 2014</b> <b>E-71</b></p>	<p><b>Campaign Disclosure – Pre-Election Reporting</b> Last day for candidates and committees to file campaign disclosure statements covering the period 1/1/14 – 3/17/14. <i>Government Code §§84200.5, 84200.7</i></p>
<p><b>March 27, 2014</b> <b>E-68</b></p>	<p><b>Ballot Measures – Rebuttal Argument – 5 p.m. Deadline</b> If both an argument in favor of and an argument against any measure have been filed, the county elections official shall send copies of each argument to the opposing author(s). The opposing author(s) may, if desired, file rebuttal arguments no later than 5pm on this day. Rebuttal arguments shall not exceed 250 words and must be accompanied by a Statement of Accuracy and signed by the author(s). Forms are available from the Merced County Elections Office. Each argument shall be titled either “Rebuttal to Argument in Favor of Measure ...” or “Rebuttal to Argument Against Measure ...” (letter designation to be filled in after assignment). <i>California Elections Code §§9167, 9317, 9504, 9600</i></p>

<p><b>April 4, 2014</b> <b>E-60</b></p>	<p><b>Military and Overseas Voters (Vote By Mail Applications)</b> The first day county elections officials may process applications for military and overseas voters' ballots. The application must include the statement that the voter cannot vote an absentee ballot during the normal absentee voting period because of military or other contingencies that preclude normal mail delivery. <i>California Elections Code §§300(b), 3103</i></p>

<p><b>April 7, 2014</b> <b>May 20, 2014</b> <b>E-57 to E-14</b></p>	<p><b>Write-In Candidate Filing Period</b> All non-presidential write-in candidates who desire to have his or her votes counted for a particular office must file a Statement of Write-In Candidacy along with the requisite number of signatures, if any, for such office. Nomination documents for write-in candidacy may be obtained from and delivered to the Merced County Elections Office between the 57th day and 14th day prior to the election. <i>California Elections Code §8601</i></p>
<p><b>April 14, 2013</b> <b>E-50</b></p>	<p><b>60 Day Report of Voter Registration</b> On or before this day, each county elections official shall prepare and send to the Secretary of State a detailed summary of the number of persons registered by party affiliation, by county and each political subdivision as of the 60th day (April 4th). <i>California Elections Code §2187(a)(c)(d)(2)</i></p>
<p><b>April 24, 2014</b> <b>May 13, 2014</b> <b>E-40 to E-21</b></p>	<p><b>State Voter Information Guides Mailing Period</b> Mailing range for voters to receive the State Voter Guide. <i>California Elections Code §9094 (a)(c)</i></p>
<p><b>April 24, 2014</b> <b>May 13, 2014</b> <b>E-40 to E-21</b></p>	<p><b>County Sample Ballot Booklets Mailing Period</b> During this period, voters receive their sample ballot booklet in the mail. The booklet will also contain polling place location and the polling place accessibility to disabled citizens. <i>California Elections Code §§13300, 13304</i></p>
<p><b>May 5, 2014</b> <b>May 27, 2014</b> <b>E-29 to E-7</b></p>	<p><b>Vote by Mail Ballots</b> Any registered voter may apply for a vote by mail ballot. Ballots must be obtained from and returned to the Merced County Elections Office either in person, via authorized representative, or by mail. Applications received prior to 29 days before the election will be processed during this period. <i>California Elections Code §§3001, 3003, 3006, 3009, 3017</i></p>
<p><b>May 5, 2014</b> <b>E-29</b></p>	<p><b>Polling Places &amp; Precinct Boards</b> At least 29 days prior to the election, the county elections official shall establish precincts, define precinct boundaries, designate polling places for each precinct, and appoint precinct board members. <i>California Elections Code §12286</i></p>
<p><b>May 5, 2014</b> <b>E-29</b></p>	<p><b>Mailed Ballot Precincts</b> On this day the county elections official shall begin mailing official ballots to voters residing in mailed ballot precincts, along with a notice indicating there will be no polling place for this election. Voted ballots must be received no later than 8 p.m. on Election Day at any polling place in Merced County or at the Merced County Elections Office. <i>California Elections Code §3005</i></p>
<p><b>May 19, 2014</b> <b>E-15</b></p>	<p><b>Last Day to Register to Vote</b> Closing date for any qualified elector to register or re-register to vote in the upcoming election. A person, who has moved, changed his or her name or wishes to change political party preference, must re-register by this date. <p><b>May 20, 2014</b> <b>May 27, 2014</b> <b>E-14 to E-7</b></p>	<p><b>New Residents</b> Registrations for new residents and citizens shall begin the 14th day prior to an election and end on the 7th day prior to election day. This registration must be executed in the Merced County Elections Office, and the new resident shall vote a new resident's ballot in that office. The new resident is eligible to vote for President and Vice-President and no other office. <i>California Elections Code §§332, 3400</i></p>
<p><b>May 20, 2014</b> <b>June 3, 2014</b> <b>E-14 to E-0</b></p>	<p><b>New Citizens</b> A new citizen registering to vote after the close of registration shall provide the Merced County Elections Office with proof of citizenship prior to voting, and shall declare that he or she has established residency in California. New citizens vote a regular ballot. <i>California Elections Code §§331, 3500, 3501</i></p>
<p><b>May 21, 2014</b> <b>E-13</b></p>	<p><b>Notice of Central Counting Place</b> Last day for the county elections official to submit a notice for legal publication specifying the public place to be used to tally votes when ballots are to be counted in a central counting place. The notice shall be published one time, no later than 10 days before the election. <i>California Elections Code §12109</i></p>

<p><b>May 22, 2014</b> E-12</p>	<p><b>Notice of Polling Places</b> Last day for the county elections official to submit a notice for legal publication the list of polling places designated for each election precinct. The notice shall be published one time, no later than 7 days before the election. <i>California Elections Code §12105</i></p>
<p><b>May 22, 2014</b> E-12</p>	<p><b>Campaign Disclosure – Second Pre-Election Reporting</b> The last day to file campaign disclosure statements for candidates and committees covering the period from March 18th through May 19th. <i>Government Code §§84200.5, 84200.7</i></p>
<p><b>May 22, 2014</b> E-12</p>	<p><b>Processing Vote By Mail Ballots</b> First day the Merced County Elections Office may begin to process (open, prepare and tabulate) vote by mail ballots for the upcoming election. <p><b>May 28, 2014</b> <b>June 3, 2014</b> E-6 to E-0</p>	<p><b>Vote by Mail Ballots – Late Conditions</b> On or between these dates, any voter may apply in person to obtain a vote by mail ballot from the Merced County Elections Office. Voters unable to request a ballot in person may designate, in writing, any person as an authorized representative to obtain and return the vote by mail ballot on their behalf. <i>California Elections Code §3021</i></p>
<p><b>June 3, 2014</b> E-0</p>	<p><b>Vote by Mail Ballots Returned</b> Vote by mail ballots may be returned in person or by authorized representative no later than 8 p.m., either to the Merced County Elections Office or to any polling place in Merced County. Ballots returned by mail must be received by 8 p.m., postmarks are not accepted. <i>California Elections Code §§3017, 3020</i></p>
<p><b>June 3, 2014</b> E-0</p>	<p><b>Election Day</b> Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day. <p><b>July 4, 2014</b> E+31</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>County Holiday (Independence Day) – Office Closed</b></p>
<p><b>July 7, 2014</b> E+34</p>	<p><b>Certificate of Election</b> Approximately on this date, the elections official shall prepare and deliver to each person elected or nominated a certificate of election or nomination signed by the elections official. <i>California Elections Code §15401</i></p>
<p><b>July 8, 2014</b> E+35</p>	<p><b>Statement of Vote to Secretary of State</b> No later than this date, the county elections official shall send, by registered mail, one complete copy of the Statement of Votes Cast to the Secretary of State. <i>California Elections Code §15375</i></p>
